Junior Sailing Second Session

On Tuesday we had our field trip to Mamaroneck harbor to go on an eighty foot Schooner, a boat with four sails. We went on a three hour cruise, and did hands on activities with the captain and deck hands. On the boat, we got to put down a fishing net, and everyone worked together to pull it back in. We caught a sea robin, jelly fish, spider crabs, windowpane flounder and a baby flounder, all which we released back into the water. Afterwards everyone helped raise the main sail, foresail, mizzen and stay sail. In addition, we went to different stations to learn more about the creatures in the Sound, how to read charts of the area we were sailing in, knot tying, and how to measure the salinity of the Sound water. Lastly, every sailor got a chance to steer the boat. A fun time was had by all, and we hope to go on the Sound Waters Schooner again in the future.
